### 1.1 Major and Minor Seconds

An Interval is the distance between two notes. The smallest interval is called a Half Step. An example of a half step would be from $C$ to Db . A Whole Step is an interval spanning to half steps ( $C$ to $D$ ).



Notice that there isn't a black key between the notes $B$ and $C$ and $E$ and $F$. This means that the interval between those notes are also a half step (minor second).
